Home Reading

Children by now are being asked to get into the habit of reading at home, either through take home readers in the younger grades or Lexiles in the older year levels.

Research indicates that homework as a general rule in Primary School has little bearing on student learning, indeed in some cases actually does more harm than good, however home reading when done properly is of great benefit.

Home reading should not be a negative task. Particularly in the younger grades take home books should be an opportunity for children to sit and read, hopefully with a caring adult, and interact with a book. It should be positive and enjoyable, it should be an opportunity for encouragement and reward. If it isn't - stop. Reading is not a punishment and should not be treated as one.

Take home readers should be at a level whereby accomplishment is a given. If reading is a chore discuss this with your child's teacher and seek strategies which keep it as a meaningful and positive.



FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2018, you do not need to complete an application form in 2019 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools in 2019 or you did not apply in 2018.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2019.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.


