Principals Report

NAIDOC Week July 3-10

This year's NAIDOC week theme is "GET UP! STAND UP! SHOW UP!"

The relationship between Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and non-Indigenous Australians needs to be based on justice, equity and recognition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples' rights.

NAIDOC Week falls during our school holidays, however, on Thursday June 23, our students are invited to dress in red, yellow and/or black and will participate in a number of school activities to celebrate our Indigenous community's history and those who have driven change and called out racism. Together, with genuine commitment to "GET UP! STAND UP! SHOW UP!, we can narrow the gap between aspiration and reality, good intent and outcome.

Mid Year Reports

Student reports provide students, teachers and parents with a clear and concise picture of a student's achievement and progress at a specific point in time. Teachers make informed and consistent decisions about student progress using a variety of assessments and observations to inform their judgement. They map the student's learning against the achievement standards, and place the student on the learning continuum. All students progress along the learning continuum at their own pace and from their own starting point. Students are taught at the level that suits their needs, rather than automatically being taught to the year level and age group that they are in. Teachers provide learning opportunities to support the learning for all students including those with additional learning needs or a disability.

If you would like to discuss your child's report or simply chat about their progress, Parent Teacher Interviews will occur in Term 3.

Classroom teachers will be available for Parent Teacher interviews next term, on Thursday 21st July from 2pm - 6pm. Booking forms will be sent home early in the first week back of Term 3.

End of Term Dismissal

This Friday, June 24 is the final day of the school term. Children will be dismissed at 1pm so will not require lunch. Term 3 will commence on Monday July 11.


